ARTIST STATEMENT

As a first-generation Mexican American, photographer Jorge Villarreal's upbringing was defined by constant motion, transition, and translation, immersing him in two distinct cultures from a very young age. Navigating the boundaries between the United States and Mexico, he pondered which side of the border best represented his identity. This early experience instilled in Villarreal a unique and dichotomous perspective that continues to inspire and guide his work as an artist.

In his series, "Untitled Walls," Villarreal captures the essence of border walls from both sides of the US/Mexico border, presenting them as storytellers. These structures, symbolic of political barriers, extend beyond merely dividing territories—they encapsulate divisions in identities, societies, economies, and cultures. Among these walls, some emerge as urban palimpsests, revealing colors and traces left behind from both cultures, whether arriving or departing.

Villarreal delves into the tension of the "between," existing as both 'of' and 'othered.' His interest lies in the use of one culture's language and identity to investigate and challenge the other. Employing color, symbolism, ritual, and iconography, he explores personal, physical, and political divisions. The photographs within the series display color gradients, symbolizing transitions between borders in both physical and mental states. They also signify the metamorphosis inherent in adjusting to a new environment. Each art piece functions as a fingerprint, identifying and revealing the transitions occurring in an area between cultures, across borders, and through time.

"Untitled Walls" invites viewers to contemplate the profound forces at play within the context of border walls, prompting reflection on the interconnectedness of cultures and the enduring impact of these physical and metaphorical barriers on our shared human experience.
