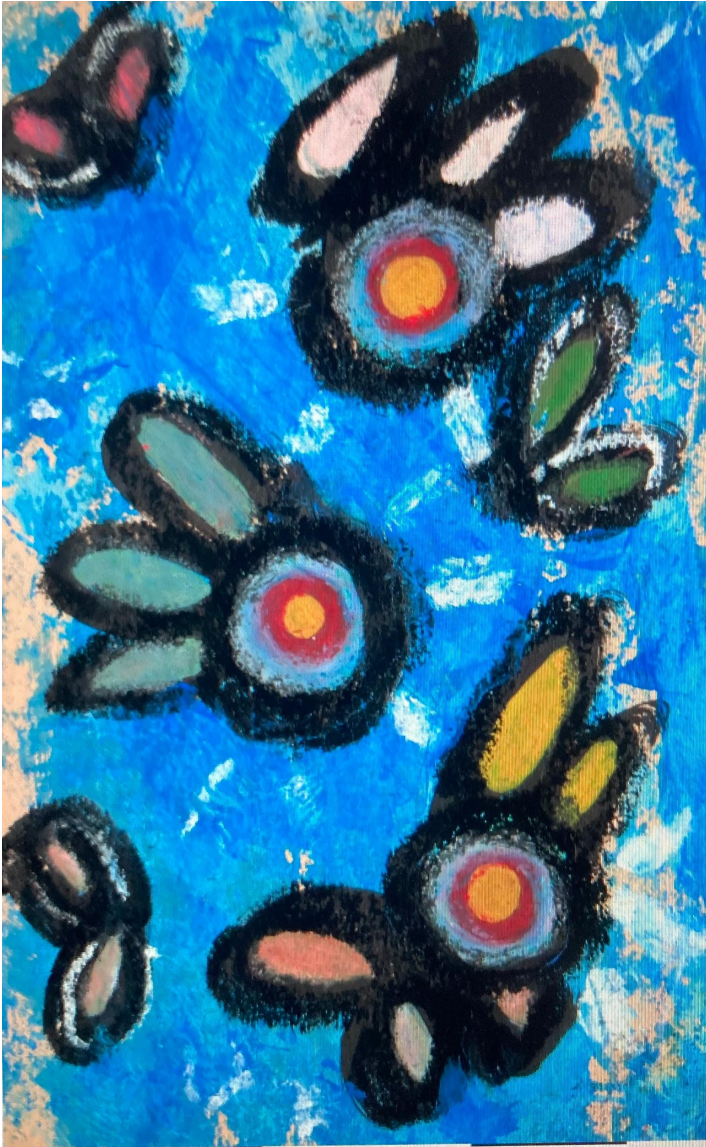


Christopher Ayers

Artist Statement:

I make art to give physical form to the structures and tensions I perceive in myself and the world around me. My work exists in the space between chaos and control, precision and looseness—but that contrast isn't just visual, it's about perception. Perfection is an illusion, shaped by my own ideas of what it should be, yet I use it to measure growth. I build structure so chaos has something to react against, making the contrast more visible. But perfection and imperfection aren't opposites—they depend on each other. Out of chaos, order emerges, and within order, chaos finds its way in. There is no real separation, only the illusion of it.

In this space of struggle and realization, I see the true relativeness of these ideas—how I navigate using them, but also how I keep them from defining my art.
